
ULTRA CORNER

The 1996 Ouachita Trail 50, May 4th, came off with a couple of interesting surprises. This year saw the largest starting field since it was downsized three years ago. 40 starters were in the lineup. 25 were "local" ultra runners. The weathers this year was a typical Arkansas late spring day - Lots of sunshine, hot and muggy. The course record holder and favorite to repeat as this years winner, Ray Bailey, experienced stomach problems early into the run and was no match for Gary Grilliot from Shreveport. Gary is no slouch and has won several trail runs around the southwest. On a good day however he is no match for Arkansas' Ray Bailey. Grilliot time was 7:39:03 and was the slowest winning time for the OT-50. Angie Ransom, Arkansas Running Klub, and a sub 24 hour 100 miler, bested a strong showing from Ivy Franklin and finished in 10:19:09. However it was determined later that Angie had gone off course at mile 45 and came into the Pinnacle Mountain aid station on the road. Realizing her mistake she was driven back to where she had gone off. In light of taking the ride back in an automobile she was disqualified by Race Directors Bill and Teresa Laster. Ivy Franklin was then declared the 1996 women's winner of the Ouachita Trail 50.*

An interesting stat to me was that of the 15 out of state runners, 12 finished within the 12 hour cut-off while 13 out of 25 local runners got an official finishing time.
